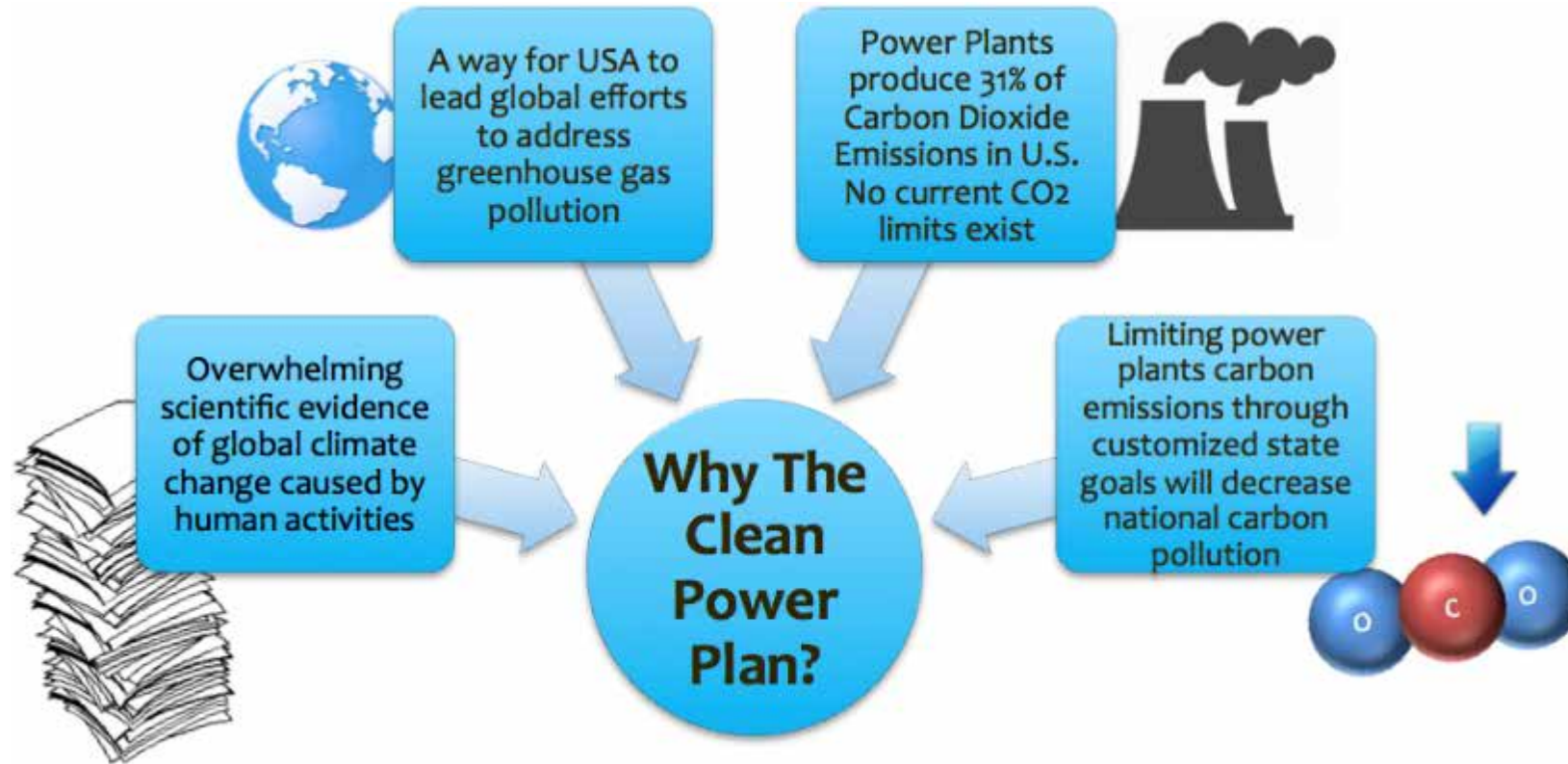

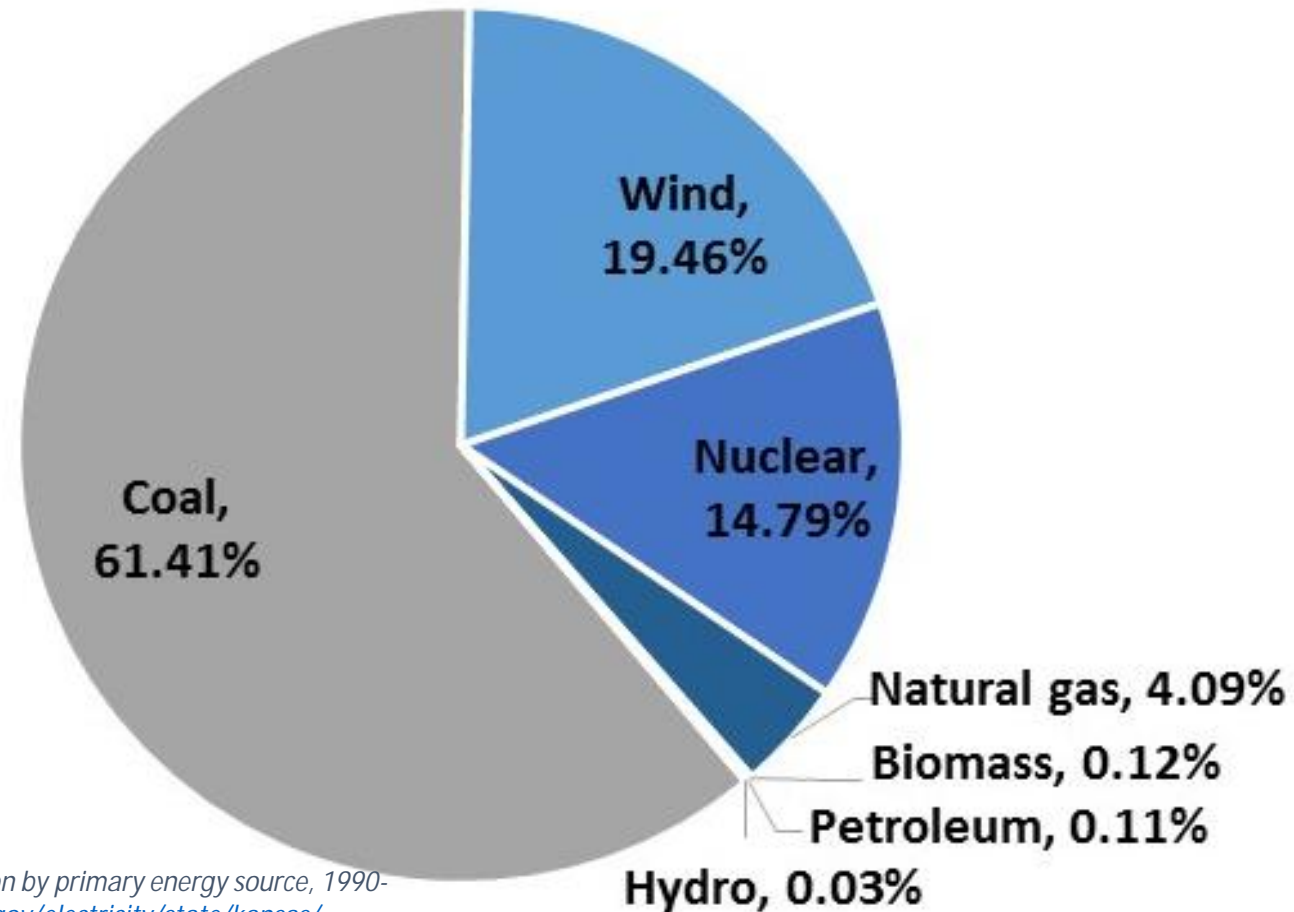

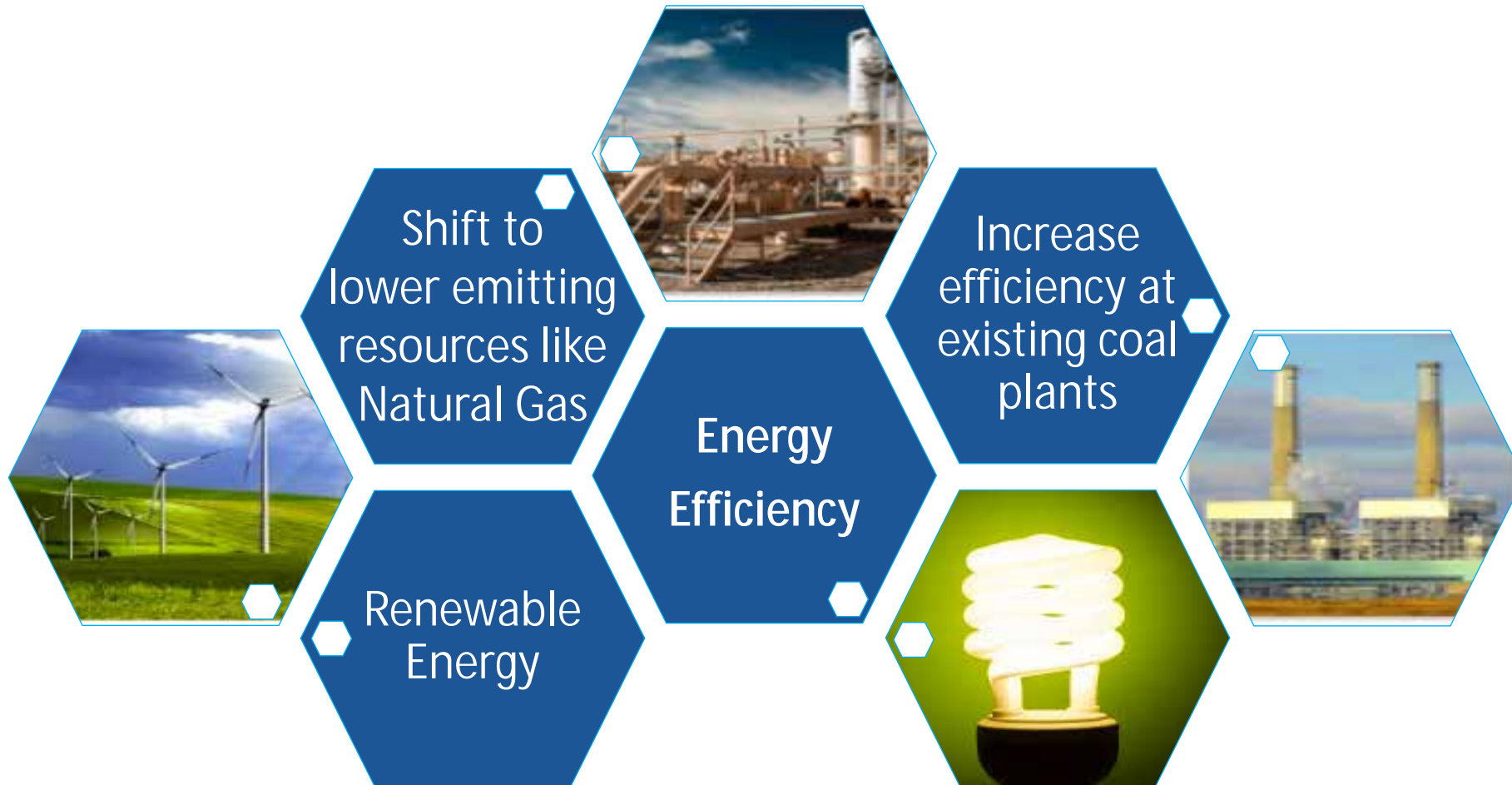
Kansas Energy Profile

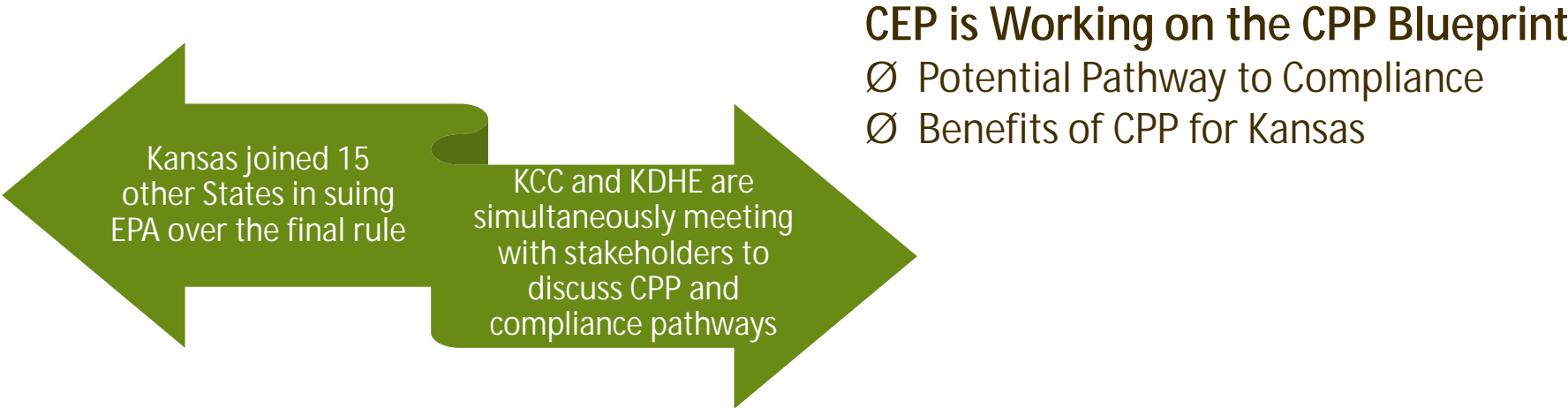
