

Goals

- Evaluate characteristics and attributes of commercially available varieties/cultivars
- Provide cover crop adaptation and growth data for different geographical regions of the U.S.
- Provide "base" information for NRCS cover crop recommendations and future studies, such as cover crop mixes
- Provide recommendations for both cropland and grazing land soil health
- Serve as a baseline for future germplasm improvement efforts
