

Kearny County – Southwest Kansas


Population Density Classifications in Kansas by County, 2016





- Places with more than 1,000 people that are farthest from any metro of more than 75,000
- Centerpoint of metro areas with more than 75,000
- ▲ Unpopulated points that are farthest from any metro of more than 75,000

Kearny County

- Southwest Kansas is a frontier area over 200 miles from any major city
- Population of Kearny County is 4,000
- Population of Lakin (county seat) is 2,000

- Plan to offer produce bundles




