



Uninsurance in Key Kansas Agricultural Counties is Declining





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Kansas hospital network reduces rate of acquired infections



As part of a federal quality improvement effort, Kansas hospitals are reducing the odds that patients will get certain types of infections.

And while that effort provides information on hospital quality throughout the state, finding information about the quality of care at individual hospitals remains a challenge.

The Kansas Healthcare Collaborative runs a <u>hospital engagement network that includes 106</u> of the state's 133 hospitals. Through a <u>federally funded program</u>, hospitals in the network are working to reduce patient harm and hospital readmissions by sharing their best practices.

Cost: Health Inflation is Moderating








