

Value-Added Producer Grant (VAPG)

VAPG Details

- VAPG awards can be used to develop new product lines from raw agricultural products or to expand a market for established products
- Working capital grants up to \$250,000
- Planning grants up to \$75,000
- Requires a \$1 producer match for each grant \$1

Value-Added Producer Grant (VAPG)

VAPG Details

- Eligible Applicants
 - Independent producers, Farmer and rancher cooperatives, Agricultural producer groups, Majority controlled producer-based business ventures
- Funds Can Be Used For:
 - Processing cost
 - Marketing and advertising expenses
 - Some inventory and salary expenses
- VAPG funds cannot be used to build facilities, produce the raw commodity or purchase equipment

2016 VAPG Awardees

2016 VAPG Awards Totaled \$785,000

- Bauman's Cedar Valley Farms, Garnett, To purchase inputs for the company's feed mill to produce non-GMO, non-medicated livestock feed
- Holy-Field Vineyard & Winery, Basehor, To expand marketing of the company's wine into Johnson County and the Leavenworth Farmers Market
- Holy Goat Creamery, Manhattan, To launch the production of farmstead cheeses made from goat's milk
- Munson Angus Farm, Junction City, Kan., To develop a marketing campaign that would sell all cuts of beef from Munson Angus Farm's cattle
- Schenker Family Farms, McCune, Kan., To launch sales of **meat-based soups** and entrees made with chicken, pork, and beef raised on the farm
- White Tail Run Winery, Edgerton, To increase the production of the winery's Seyval Blanc wines

2016 – Value-Added Producer Grant Award

Bauman's CVF

- Garnett, Kansas
- \$49,948 VAPG
- In 2015, Bauman's opened the feed mill because of a need for non-GMO poultry feed, and now they produce feed for swine and small and large ruminants as well
- Funds will help purchase inputs for the feed, as well as marketing the feed with new feed sack design



2015 – Value-Added Producer Grant

Hildebrand Dairy

- Junction City, Kansas
- VAPG award was to expand the company's sales of processed milk into western and southeast Kansas
- The company's milk is sold in glass bottles in more than 105 grocery stores across the state



2014 – Value-Added Producer Grant Award

Wiebe Cheese

- Durham, Kansas
- Funds will be used to expand Wiebe Dairy's production of farmstead cheeses
- Dill Weed, Garlic & Herb, White Cheddar with Garden Vegetable, Jalapeño, Colby, Hot Habanero, Cajun Cheese, Southwest Chipotle, Raw milk cheeses, Cottonwood River Cheddar (Reserve)



REAP Details

- Provides guaranteed loan financing and grant funding to agricultural producers and rural small businesses for renewable energy systems or to make energy efficiency improvements.


ARC Technology

- Family owned and operated rural small business with 8 full-time employees who provide Engineering Services



Foster Dairy

- Family Farm in Fort Scott, Kansas
- Six fans were purchased in total, three 12-foot fans, and three 16foot fans
- The six new fans replaced, 24 fans that were 36-inch fans



Ag REAP Projects

- Upgrade lighting and equipment for dairy, swine, poultry facilities
- Update an inefficient grain dryer
- Solar waters/fencers
- Irrigation motor/pump conversions

Next REAP Deadline

- Continuously accept applications throughout the year
- Next deadline for grants and combination grant/loan request is March 31, 2017
- In 2016, awarded nearly \$500,000 in REAP grants
