SCCC Grants

- STEM \$4.2 million 2011-2016
 - Specialty Crops emphasis (approximately \$1.8 million)
 - 2 Greenhouses (30 x 60)
 - 4 High Tunnels (20 x 48) (one moveable HT)
 - 4 acre Garden Field
 - | Equipment
- SCBG Grants
 - 2015 and 2016: Specialty Crops Incubator Program
 - i 2015: Enterprise Budgets

Specialty Crops Incubator Program

- 8 quarter acre plots plus high tunnel space
- Participants
 - 8 hours college credit (spring, summer, fall)
 - \$2500 commitment
 - SCCC provides all inputs, equipment, personnel, expertise, potential market
 - Participants own vegetables produced (\$5000)
 - | Potential 3 years in SCIP
- Designed to foster specialty crop growers

SCCC 2015 SCBG Enterprise Budget Grant

- Full time position (Natalya Lowther, February 2016)
- Develop enterprise budgets that could be used as templates to expand the number of crops with budgets
- Grant was extended to March 2017
- Disseminate at conferences, online, hard copy

Enterprise Budget Grant

- 2016: Develop 8 Templates
- High Tunnels (1000 square feet) tomatoes, salad greens
- Market Garden (10,000 square feet) turnips, beets
- Large Field (acre) sweet corn, sweet potatoes
- Tiny Crops (100 square feet) basil, sprouts
- Small Fruits (acre) strawberries, blackberries
- Tree and Nut Fruits (acre) apples, pecans
- Grapes (acre) table
- Hydroponic Greenhouse (1000 square feet) tomatoes

Conferences and Workshops

- Specialty Crops: Production, Marketing, Management
 - 1st Tuesday in February (Feb. 7, 2017)
 - 8 educational sessions (Postcard)
- Specialty Crops: High Value and Sustainable
 - ú 3 day Workshop in June

 - ú 15 hours Continuing Ed, 1 hour undergraduate credit (SCCC), 1 hour graduate credit (KSU)

- 2015: 24 weeks with 3000 people participating
- 2016: 28 weeks, 3000 people
- 2017: Pick Your Own, SCCC Farmers Market

- Strawberries (750)
- Asparagus (2015)
- Rhubarb (2015, move few)
- Horseradish (20)
- Raspberries (90)
- Blackberries (70)
- Blueberries (50)
- Grapes (32)
- Fruit Trees (32)



Specialty Crops Equipment

- Around 20 "presents"
- 2 Tractors
- No till drill
- Raised bed, drip tape, plastic mulch layer
- Transplanter
- Plastic Remover (sweet potato digger)
- Lettuce harvester
- Air Blast Sprayer
- Vegetable Washer
- 2 Coolers
- Numerous tillage equipment, etc.
